



Neamţ Land is a territory that proudly stands for centuries in the heart of Moldavia, and impresses its visitors everytime. Whether we think of the majestic Ceahlău Massif, the calm and enchanted waters of River Bistriţa, the old dwellings commisioned by Stephen the Great, the mastery of the paintings from Agapia and Durău Monasteries, or the evocative atmosphere of Humuleşti, all of them speak of a long history, and a special kind of spirituality. Neamţ County delineates a land with an aura of legend, a living history in pages of literature. The writings of lon Creangă, Calistrat Hogaş, Alexandru Vlahuţă and Mihail Sadoveanu reveal a land with a wild nature, with hospitable and welcoming people, and a great past, embedded in Romanian spirituality.

All the four fundamental myths of the Romanians are well represented in the folklore of Neamţ Land: the myth of foundation, the myth of creation and human sacrifice, the shepherd myth and the myth of the incubus.

Traveling in the homeland of memories, Neamt County is our invitation for you to come and get to know these places up close and personal. It will be a worthwhile experince, for sure. Miron Costin described the beauty of these places as such:"...Should the Greek goddesses had found out about these lands, they would of course have come here, from their home Olympus".





Izvorul Muntelui Lake

Along River Bistrița, from Poiana Largului to Bicaz, lies the largest reservoir on the inland rivers in Romania: Lake Izvorul Muntelui. On a 35-kilometer-long stretch of water, along with the hills that overlook it, the villages set on the valleys and the mountain peaks of the more distant landscapes offer scenic landscapes that can easily be seen from the road that closely follows the shores of the lake. At the viewpoint from Hangu, nature reveals in front of your eyes in all its splendor, because of the perfect reflection of Ceahlău Massif ("The Pawn") in the mirror of water of "the sea between the mountains", as Lake Izvorul Muntelui is often called.

Before arriving in Bicaz, the wide surface of the still mountain lake stretches behind Bicaz Dam of 127m high, resembling a concrete mountain parapet, that holds up to 1250000 cubic meters of water. Bicaz dock, located near the dam, is the starting point for boat rides, pedal boat rides, kayaking and other various water sports. Tourists can serve delicios dishes at the Floating Restaurant, and spend the night at a guesthouse nearby, enjoyng the fresh air and amazing views.










Ceahlăul – "The Olympus of Moldavia"

None of the mountains in Romania has ever charmed the eyes or ignited the imagination of hikers as Ceahlău Massif has. It majestically rises tall, like a giant dome of the Eastern Carpathians, on the legendary territory of Neamt Land. Ceahlău is much like a huge and impressive open-air museum displaying exhibits that carry the life story in the form of a legend or simple toponym: Dochia, Panaghia, Toaca, Dorobantul, the Monks, the Rock in Tears, Butu's Tower, the Shelves with lilies, Detunatele and many, many others ... It is a vast island of flora and fauna, exquisitely refined through ancestral geological turmoil. Also known as "the Holy Mount of the Dacians" or "the mountain of prayer", its legendary allure is complemented by its impressive, massive appearance, and a certain mysterious aura surrounding it. Dominating the mountains around, due to its relatively lonely position, which allows its perfect visibility, like an old pyramid or a promontory, Ceahlău Massif is easily seen from many parts of Moldavia and Transylvania.

Consisting of a radius peaks system that converge to two points of maximum height, Ocolaşul Mare Peak (1907m) and Toaca Peak (1904m), Ceahlău Massif stretches on



more than 290 square kilometers, of which only 10% is occupied by the alpine abyss delimited by steep stone walls, which create the appearance of a fortress. Ever since the beginning of time, from the surroundings or

Ever since the beginning of time, from the surroundings or from the mountain peaks, the beholders' eyes, caressed by the sun, sought to rejoice and find the ever vivid and overwhelming miracle of nature.









Cuejdel Lake

Mild hills overlapping, wide deciduous forests, green pastures with sheep flocks, and the mirror of water of Lake Cuejdel bordered by a mountain slope which overturned its course, reveal the picturesque landscape of a mountain lake formed not long ago. This is Cuejdel, a natural dam lake, formed between 1978 and 1991 in Stânişoarei Mountains. With a length of 1 km, an area of about 281,700 acres and depths varying between 7m and 14m, it is nowadays the largest natural dam lake in Romania.

Lake Cuejdel, with many trunks of broken trees coming out of the still surface of the water, is a wild oasis, with captivating specimens of flora and fauna, a landscape changing colors from one season to the next, impressing every time.

Bicaz Gorges

At the west entrance gate, as you come from Transylvania, you encounter an impressive landscape that greets you right when entering the beautiful Neamt Land: Bicaz Gorges. From ancient times until today, the furious waters of Bicaz creek dug up the mountain and formed the most spectacular gorges in the country. The landscape is breathtaking, and you do not know whether it is a dream or reality: giant stone walls that rise up in an attempt to touch the sky, make way for a serpentine road of rare beauty, accompanied all along by the mountain waters roaring while tumbling down over large stone boulders. "The Altar Stone", impressively and majestically guarding the road, recalls those times when the Dacians, Romanian's ancestors, used to practice their worship rituals here, about 5000 years ago; "The "Hell's Throat" is a place where the rocky massifs meet up in the sky, as if they want to unite and become one again, while "The Guardian", a straight wall that completes the apocalyptic landscape, whispers stories about all the brave climbers who tried to escalate it, in the attempt to push their limits. Tourists can choose among 18 hiking trails crossing Bicaz Gorges, a unique attraction with overwhelming landscapes. The wilderness and massiveness of the limestone cliffs, crossed by the winding road, transform the entire area into an spectacular and interesting place

not only for tourists from Romania and abroad, but also





for climbing enthusiasts.



Monasteries in Neamţ


The monasteries in Neamt area keep their pace and serenity, passing over time, over successive transformations of society, over generations, as if they had been there since the beginning of time. Such evidence of the Romanian faith is Neamt Monastery, one of the oldest monasteries in Moldavia and a gem of the Romanian Orthodoxy. Located in the village of Vânători-Neamt, near the town of Târgu-Neamt, the monastic settlement includes the church, dating back from the 14th century, an invaluable religious art museum and a museum of print, and the oldest monastic library, counting over 12,000 volumes in 1862, testimonies about significant historical, theological, cultural and artistic facts. Neamt Monastery is the result of the successive foundations of the voivodes Petru I Muşat, Alexander the Blessed and Stephen the Great, between the 14th-16th centuries. A place full of history and holiness is waiting for you to step down its threshold, with piety and good intentions. Here, it seems that time has lost count and one can easily find peace of mind and heart.


Among the valuable monastic settlements that attract visitors both from Romania and abroad are the monasteries of Văratec, Agapia, Sihla, Sihăstria, Secu, Petru Vodă, Neamţ, Bistriţa, Pângăraţi, Bisericani, Horaiţa, Nechit, Tazlău and Războieni, as well as the hermitages of Agapia Veche, Icoana Nouă, Daniil Sihastru and Pocrov. Neamţ Monastery and Bistriţa Monastery are notable for their age, Pângăraţi Monastery for its unique architecture



among the monasteries in Moldavia, Agapia Nunnery for the exceptional paintings of Nicolae Grigorescu, and Sihla Monastery for the life full of piety of Saint Theodora. The spiritual and historical inheritance of the monasteries in Neamţ County is priceless. Whether you are impressed by the religious significance of these places, or interested in the historical and architectural importance of the settlements, you will surely have planty to discover and share with your friends.

Wooden churches

Churches made of wood, where tradition, faith and holiness blend together, represent genuine hearths where faith has never faded away. You cannot know the true meaning of faith until you enter at least once into a wooden church. The smell of old wood and the atmosphere inside transport you into another world and create a strong sense of connectedness between man and God. Wood lacework arranged in bands and increasingly large and rich decorative fields, folkcraft decorations made in the most authentic Moldavian style, paintings on a layer of plaster, folk architecture made using wood carving, engraving and sculpting techniques, all these are the elements that characterize these architectural jewels. There is an atmosphere of peace and calm that surrounds them, where you can put your senses to rest for a few moments, forgetting about the hustle and bustle of everyday life.

Mentioned in historical documents since the 14th century, these wooden jewels are part of the archaic forms of the Orthodox Christian faith, and offer wonderful views alongside the picturesque landscapes of the villages in Neamt.

Among Romania's picturesque and always surprising landscapes, Dămuc commune in Neamţ County is a breathtaking area, located at a really high altitude.

A charming mountain village with forests as far as the eye can see, Dămuc is situated between two majestic mountain ranges, Tarcău Mountains and Hăşmaşul Mare Mountains, not far away from the impressive Bicaz Gorges. No matter what season you come here, "The Land at the Foothill of Hăşmaş" is one of the most beautiful tourist areas in the country, unique for its spectacular landscapes. The houses are built according to the traditional mountain architecture. The locals are welcoming and warm-hearted people, and tell their stories to everyone who's willing to listen. Here, one can finally escape from the pressure of daily existence, feel that different rhythm of life that can only be experienced in the countryside, and enjoy the really simple and healthy living.

Bicăjel River Valley and Trei Fântâni Village are continuously increasing their tourist visibility, due to their proximity to the much sought-after Bicaz Gorges and also to some other tourist attractions in the area: Bicăjel Gorges, Şugău Nature Reserve, Munticelu Cave, and last, but not least, Via Ferrata Astragalus.

The renowned pilgrimage routes of Camino de Santiago and Via Mariae, dating back to the Middle Ages, cross the teritorry of Neamţ County, starting in 2022.


Camino de Romania

A network of pilgrim routes that have traversed Europe since the Dark Ages, known as "Camino de Santiago", has recently included Romania and now crosses through Neamt County as well, serving as a bridge between the Orthodox and Catholic churches, tourist attractions, and theme parks along the pilgrimage walks. "Camino de Romania" begins in Iași County, passes through Neamț and Bacău counties, then crosses the Carpathians into Transylvania, through Covasna County. The route is part of "Camino de Santiago" or "St. James Way", which attracts pilgrims from all over Europe. Annually, approximately 350,000 pilgrims from 160 countries choose to travel the "Camino de Santiago" network of routes that spread across the entire continent. On October 23, 1987, the Council of Europe declared the Camino de Santiago as the first European Cultural Itinerary. "Camino de România

– Neamţ County" pilgrimage route includes the Roman area, starting from the north, in Gherăeşti Commune, and descending south to Izvoare, Bahna Commune. The connection to Iaşi County is made through Iugani, and to Bacău County, through Racova.






Via Mariae

Via Mariae pilgrimage route (also named "Mary's Way") is a spiritual tourist path rooted in the veneration of St. Mary by the nations of Central and Eastern Europe, but it also connects the shrines of Mary, without interfering with any historical, cultural, or religious differences. The route dedicated to honoring the Holy Virgin now stretches across Neamt County, where monasteries and churches hidden in the thick forests, scattered in quiet clearings and in the beautiful valleys, await you to cross their thresholds. Via Mariae draws a large cross on the map of Central Europe -going through Austria, Hungary, Romania, Slovakia, Poland, Croatia, and Bosnia- thus creating a network of pilgrimage routes based on local values. "Via Mariae – Neamt County" pilgrimage route is a segment of the European pilgrimage route VIA MARIAE. The extension of the route in Neamt was possible due to the joint efforts of Neamt County Council, the Metropolis of Moldavia and Bukovina, Neamt Forestry Service, Vânători-Neamt Natural Park Administration Centre, the local councils of Vânători-Neamt, Pipirig, Agapia, Crăcăoani, Gârcina, Pângărati, and Tarcău communes, "Eco Travel" Association, at the initiative of "Via Mariae" Association from Harghita County. So, we invite you to take the road less traveled and to become pilgrims, even for a few days, to visit holy places full of spiritual, cultural and historical meaning, to enjoy en-route adventures and stunning landscapes along the way!

Neamţ Fortress

The name of Neamt Fortress stays forever written in the history pages of Neamt County. For more than six centuries, from ancient times, the fortress stands on the valley of River Ozana, heroically guarding the land and the Moldavian people. Commissioned by Petru I Muşat and then extended and consolidated under the rule of Stephen the Great, who also set up a defense trench with an arched bridge, the imposing fortress resisted many sieges of the many enemies. The 8-day opposition to the furious Ottoman siege led by the fearsome Mehmed the Conqueror, following the battle of Războieni (1476), or the glorious episode written in their own blood by the 19 frontier guards facing the Polish army led by Jan Sobieski in 1691 are stories whispered by the walls of the fortress. Declared a historical monument in 1866 and restored prior to 2009 under the PHARE Programme, the fortress rises serenely on the hill limiting the town of Târgu-Neamt and belongs to the category of medieval monuments of great historical value in Romania. It stands as a living proof of the rich history of Neamt County. The museum offers 21 exhibition rooms for visitors to explore within the fortress, all of which recreate the image of glorious, old times past.

wEvery year, close to the 2nd of July, the day when people commemorate the Holy Prince Stephen the Great, locals celebrate "Days of Neamţ Fortress", a much beloved medieval festival gathering thousands of people in Târgu-Neamţ.




"Ion Creangă" Memorial Museum

The house in which lon Creangă, the much beloved Romanian author, was born and raised, still stands quietly in Humuleşti, as a proof of the real existence of the characters from his worldwide famous Memories from childhooh. You can see the chimney pole with rope and tassel at the end for cats to play with, the hearth of the mantelpiece where Nică leaned when he was learning to walk, the oven that he was hiding when he was playing peek-a-boo, even the weaving and spinning tools of his mother, the trees in the yard, they are all intact - precious memories that accompany us throughout our life. The museum house has been restored, preserving all the peculiarities of the folk architecture of that time, and inside you will discover a rich collection of traditional household items, a true ethnographic treasure. Built in 1830 by Petrea Ciubotariul -lon Creangă's grandfather-, the house became a museum in 1951. The simplicity of the courtyard and the house, the interiors specific to the traditional village in Neamt area, reminding of the beautiful Moldavian traditions, emanate a sweet and gentle tranquility, far from the madding crowd. Here you can experience the sensation that Nica's adventures intertwine with those of your childhood, and the child within you is reborn, allowing you the pleasure of entirely immersing yourself in the serenity and carelessness of that time.

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




"Cucuteni" Eneolithic Art Museum

The Cucuteni Eneolithic Art Museum is housed in a beautiful building belonging to the Princely Court Ensemble in Piatra Neamt, built in 1930, by entrepreneur Carol Zani, after a project of the former Chief architect Roger Bolomey, and shelters the richest and most valuable collection in Europe of artefacts belonging to Cucuteni - Trypillia Culture. On display, various ceramic objects, distinguished by their monochrome, bicrom or tricrom paintings, elegant and refined shapes that offer a comprehensive picture of the decorative and figurative art belonging to the most important Eneolithic culture in Southeastern Europe. Developed between 3600-2600 B.C., the collection includes some eight hundred items, most of them tanking in the hoard category. Here, you can admire priceless exhibits such as "The Small Columns Vessel", "Frumuşica Hora", "Hora-type Vessel", statuettes in the group of "The Goddesses' Synaxis", "The Thinker of Târpeşti", to name only a few. Considered to be the highest achievement during Eneolithic Europe, Cucuteni - Trypillia ceramics achieve perfection through the motifs of the decoration, predominantly the spiral, painted with natural pigments, and why not, as the researchers say, even with the artist's own blood.

The Cucuteni Eneolothic Art Museum represents the achievement of the desire of several generations of archaeologists and recognition of the constant efforts made for over seven decades by the Museum of History and Archaeology in Piatra Neamt.









Village Museums

On a green slope, behind a traditional fence, the gate opens onto a large yard, with an open-air alley. On either side of the alley, among fruit trees, you will see many fairy-tale characters -carved in wood or stonethat enliven the entire atmosphere, and at the end of the alley a traditional house with wooden porch stands firmly on the ground. It is the house of the famous artisan Neculai Popa from Târpeşti - Petricani, transformed into a true ethnographic museum that shelters various objects crafted by the artisan and his wife, as well as others items collected from the villagers nearby. Should you be willing to listen, "The Piper", one of the statues carved in stone by the artisan, will sing you about the famous craftsmen of Târpeşti village. The masks with intriguing faces will show you villain features of the people, and the plethora of fairytale characters sculpted in wood or stone which decorate the yard stand as testimony of a genuine, yet bygone talent.

After leaving Târgu-Neamţ, when heading towards Pipirig, in Lunca village, on a narrow street, behind a fence with carved wooden gates, you can visit the house of another woodworking master, Vasile Găman. The house is an oasis of Romanian traditions, where you can admire a rich and diverse collection of crafted items specific to the area. Here, you will have the pleasure of being told stories about what and how it was, by master Găman himself, who happily awaits guests to cross his threshold.














Traditional crafts

Neamt area can be looked upon as a genuine "wood civilization", with local craftsmen using wood in many occupations, from building houses with high roofs and wide eaves to protect the porch from rain and snow, to the churches they erected in the heart of the villages as a testimony of their faith, and to the small furniture or household items. The old houses that still exist today are true testimonies to the skill of the craftsmen from Neamt. Another part of traditional crafts is proudly represented by the art of weaving, embroidery and traditional costumes, a field in which Neamt County has always excelled in diversity and refinement, as seen in the numerous traditional works of art produced over time: rugs, carpets, table runners, towels, saddle bags, belts, blouses, tablecloths, curtains, headbands, and much more... The making of traditional masks is a characteristic feature of Neamt, with craftsmen creating objects with rich emotional symbolism, usually representing animals such as goats, horses, bears, wolves, deer, or characters from popular mythology or folklore. Masks of all kinds can be admired at winter festivals, which are still celebrated according to ancient customs in this region.

Customs and traditions in Neamţ

Learned by doing over centuries, customs and canons kept in community awareness are still observed today in Neamt villages. The customs that have been preserved to this day have a time-tested value, being often connected to faith. In the mountain villages, you can still attend the sheepherding in spring and round-up and sorting the sheep in autumn. In winter, women still join evening sittings to show their skills of weaving and embroidering, creating items of exquisite artistic value to adorn the houses. Every year, when celebrating major events in rural comunities, people participate in the hora, accompanied by music played on the flute, pan flute, trumpet, and drums, to the delight of all dancers. Winter holidays traditions form the longest, richest and merriest folk festival. They represent the living archive of the inhabitants' spirituality, better preserved in the villages of Neamt County. Carols are a must on Christmas festivals – carols and religious theme dramas are performed by groups of children or youth. The New Year is greeted with "Pluguşorul", the small bottomless barrel covered with skin, cattle or sheep bells, and even with an ox-driven plough. Then, the village sky is filled with sounds of "sorcova" and spectacular mask dances – she-goat, stag, bear, young horsemen dance, and the outlaws' drama. Winter traditions in this area include a rich and varied repertoire, which impresses by message, folk costumes, and music.

Gastronomy

In Neamt, whether you stop for a shorter period or stay longer, you will be able to indulge in traditional platters prepared from smoked pork loin, homemade sausages, meatballs, headcheese, bacon, cheese with red onion, all prepared according to culinary traditions of the region. Other well-known Moldovan dishes that will tingle your taste buds are sour soup with a little bit of borscht, dresala, jellied meat, trout hârzob and, last but not least, a Moldovan stew made with pork, polenta and egg, sheep's feta cheese, and sausages. Delicious poale-n brâu pies filled with sweet or salty cheese, Moldavian "alivenci" served hot and garnished with sour cream, or puff pastry swirls, complete the rich list of traditional dishes. If you want to quench your thirst, the hosts will welcome you with a syrup made from fir buds, perfect for hot summer days, and in the winter cold, with a blueberry liqueur made from forest fruits from the mountains of Neamt, to accompany the stories told around the fireplace.




"Dragoş Vodă" Bison and Carpathian Fauna Reserve

VÂNĂTORI – NEAMŢ NATURAL PARK

Located in the north of Neamt County, within Vânători-Neamt Natural Park, "Dragos Vodă" Bison and Carpathian Fauna Reserve shelters bisons, Carpathian deers, elks, a pair of mouflons, roe deers, foxes, wolves, and various species of birds. Among the three ponds in the reserve, "Bison Lake" hides beautiful specimens of carp, crucian carp, pike-perch, pike, and perch in its peaceful waters. The suspended bridge in the forest, made of wood and raised to a height of 15-20 meters over a length of 200 meters, allows for the observation of fauna and vegetation in this protected area. The bison, the heraldic symbol of Moldova and Europe's largest land animal, disappeared from the Carpathian fauna in 1800 but reappeared in 1970 with three specimens, two years after the establishment of this reserve. "Dragos Vodă" Bison and Carpathian Fauna Reserve was established in 1969, and is unique in Romania, since it is the only zoo in the countryside, located at a great distance from the increasingly concentrated urban agglomerations.

Bison Land in Neamţ County – Best Ecotourism Destination

BISON SAFARI

The importance and attractiveness of Bison Land as a tourist destination has increased significantly over the past years, as is became worldwide known and sought after by a large number of both national and foreign visitors. Vânători-Neamţ Natural Park Administration has also arranged a Bison museum and two trails that allow tourists to encounter European bisons in their natural habitat.

So, if you come to Neamt, make sure you don't miss the one of a kind experience of Bison Safari! You can practice Bison Safari either on foot or by using an offroad vehicle, accompanied by a ranger, observing bisons roaming in the wild, and other animals from the rich wildlife of the natural park.

Tourists have the opportunity to explore Bison Land, the Best Ecotourism Destination in Romania, internationally acclaimed and annually awarded since 2017 for the good practices of conservation, promotion and development of the area. The European bison has been thriving here since the spring of 2012, when five bisons, three males and two females, were released. Bison Land is the only place in Europe where the bison, heraldic symbol of Moldavia and the largest land animal on the continent can be seen, in three kind of habitats: in freedom in the forests of the Park, in semi-freedom in the acclimatization enclosure,



and in captivity inside "Dragoş Vodă" Carpathian Wildlife and Bisons Reserve.

A species on the verge of extinction 10 years ago is now the pride of the Moldavian forests, being hosted in Bison Land, which overlaps Vânători-Neamţ Natural Park. Over 60 bisons roam free here, half of which came to life in this amazing natural area, spreading on a surface of approximately 76.160 acres.

A bison safari through the forests in Neamţ gives you the opportunity to observe, get close and enjoy the encounter with a real bison (which weighs about a ton), one you can find in the nature park, assisted by a ranger, on foot or by car, in the wild or in semi-freedom.

Every season, but especially in autumn, local producers, talented craftsmen and artists from Neamţ gather at EcoBrunches in Bison Land, events celebrating both culture and gastronomy, that support the preservation of local authenticity, and the promotion of Bison Land as the only ecotourism destination in Romania included in Top 100 Sustainable Destinations worldwide.

VÂNĂTORI – NEAMŢ NATURAL PARK

A perfect blend of nature, spirituality, history, and culture has given rise to a sacred space in Neamt, also known as "the Athos of Romania". The location overlaps Vânători-Neamt Natural Park and Romsilva District, with an area of over 74132 acres, of which 64248 acres are forests, home to 41 species of mammals, 103 species of birds, and seven species of fish. Even more interesting is that over a quarter of the plant species in Romania can be found here. The park's maximum altitude of Buhalnita Peak (1,231 meters) is not by far the most impressive fact. What realy catches the eye and soothes the soul is the idyllic aspect of the territory, seemingly taken out of fairy tales, which hosts a large number of monastic settlements, approximately 1000 monks and nuns living in the six monasteries and ten hermitages in the area. There are also monks living in seclusion in the woods, proof of the fact that there has been uninterrupted monastic activity in the area since the 14th century.

The monastic villages of Văratec and Agapia represent the largest Orthodox monastic settlement in the world. The presence of nuns and monks communities in these places for hundreds of years has actually shaped a very special interaction with the landscape and developed a unique model of conservation and preservation. The long



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history of the place and everything that has been built in this area represents, in fact, a form of sustainable social economy. In a place full of beauty and spirituality, which still preserves the peaceful atmosphere of days past, and people honor the "customs of the earth", visitors can spend a very special holiday, away from the noise and stress of daily existence.

And because this corner of heaven in Neamţ is so special, starting from April 2021, the monastic cultural landscape of Vânători – Neamţ has been included on the tentative list of UNESCO Cultural Heritage Monuments.






Leisure and recreation

Tourists are welcome to the scenic and exciting four seasons world of Durău Park, a ski slope during winter and amusement park during summer, where a mountaintop of fun, excitement and beauty is awaiting for them.

The picturesque landscapes along the villages are a sure invitation to biking trips, off-road or ATV-riding, paintball, archery and more. The municipal lido in Piatra-Neamţ and
